### **We aim to achieve this by:**

- Creating forums to share, discuss, and test models of high quality therapeutic residential and foster care.
- Sharing and disseminating University research on residential and foster care, and the needs of looked after children.

### **Our core values; we support and promote:**

- Models of care that are relationship (attachment) based.
